PARCC Informational Guide

What is PARCC?

PARCC stands for “The **P**artnership for **A**ssessment of **R**eadiness for **C**ollege and **C**areers (PARCC)” a consortium of states that collaboratively developed a common set of assessments to measure student achievement and preparedness for college and careers. The State of NJ is a member of the consortium of states and must administer PARCC in all public schools.

The PARCC assessments are aligned to the New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS) and were created to measure students' ability to apply their knowledge of concepts rather than memorizing facts. The PARCC assessments require students to solve problems using mathematical reasoning and to be able to model mathematical principles. In English Language Arts (ELA), students will be required to closely read multiple passages and to write essay responses in literary analysis, research tasks and narrative tasks. The assessments will measure mastery of the standards. The assessments will also provide teachers information on student progress to inform instruction and provide targeted student support.

What is the NJDOE PARCC Portfolio Appeal Process?

- ***NJDOE PARCC Portfolio Appeal Process***

Students who **did not** take the PARCC Assessments, or were **unable to achieve a passing score** on the PARCC Assessments, or unable to achieve a passing score on the **alternative standardized exams** will need to successfully complete the **NJ Department of Education (NJDOE) Portfolio Appeal Process** in order to earn a high school diploma.
