

Schools in the City School District of New Rochelle are closed due to precautions for coronavirus (COVID-19), but our commitment to education does not stop.

While all schools will remain closed through March 25th, the District will implement a Distance Learning Plan (DLP) so students can continue to learn and grow. Our goal is to ensure all students receive essential learning and practice while schools are closed. As such, our approach ensures equitable learning access for all students.

We have collaborated with educators, families and our community to support and maximize our scholars' experiences at home. Every student has a shared responsibility to continue their educational journey. We must not let this worldwide crisis slow our progress in driving our educational goals.

Due to the complexity of curriculum for different ages, plus limitations to an online-only model, we have customized our learning guidance for our students. Elementary grade students will have a daily reading expectation, while secondary school students will use Google Classroom for their lessons. In the Distance Learning Center you will find distinct guidance and expectations for elementary, middle school and high school students, as well as teacher resources.
