Superintendents Update

Dr. Lloyd stated that our Uniondale High School students together with Hofstra University were involve with a School/Community/University Project to determine the level of voter participation and to encourage residents to go out and vote. Mr. Mark Sippin, Director of Social Studies, had the students, Jallene Pineda, Nia Childs, Justine Gaskins, Nikkita Alexander, Vanessa Bueno and Gisselle Rodriguez-Benitez, introduce themselves and tell of their experiences. They all seemed excited and pleased with the people they met and what they learned. Each student praised and expressed appreciation for the assistance they received from their Advanced Social Studies teacher, Mr. Michael Mullervy. Dr. Lloyd acknowledged Mr. Paul Gibson, a great community member, who was very instrumental in getting this project going.

Mr. David Tellier, Partner, of Nawrocki Smith, presented the External Audit Report for the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year.

Comments by the Board:

Ms. Gisselle Benitez spoke of a planned student wide Student Council Meeting to be held at Uniondale High School. They will discuss improvements, common concerns, a brochure regarding summer programs, leadership and expansion plans. There are concerns that keeping the campus away from 9th graders would not allow them to participate in High School programs. They are looking into a partnership with Healing Soles which provides footwear and meals for the homeless. They would like to unify all the schools in one project.

Ms. Sharpe mentioned the New York State School Boards Association Convention that was recently held in Buffalo, NY. He felt it was one of the best with excellent workshops. There were updated concerns - Security, SWAT teams' misconceptions and protocol. Very important that we maintain a chain of command. Among the many topics there was Common Core, Law Conferences, Transgender concerns, educating every child and being fair.

Mr. Georges referred to the recent Newsletter regarding the building projects and three (3) scenarios are identified by the Board. We need to have community input at meetings as to the scenarios we should adopt before we go further with the expansion and restructuring. More research needs to be done and more effort needs to be put into educating the community. We need to have pride in our elementary schools.

Mr. Cubas expressed his concern that the Country is divided after the recent election. He thanked all those involved, Mr. Sippin, the Greater Uniondale Area Action Coalition (GUAAC) in guiding our students, who are our future, and encouraging them to participate in all elections. Mr. Cubas mentioned that Dr. Mangum fell just prior to the meeting and is in the hospital. We are hoping she will be well.

Mr. Mott also mentioned the many workshops in Buffalo. He attended one on Solar Paneling and spoke of grid problem failure. One of the sessions that was standing room only was on the "Dos and Dont's of a School Board".

Mr. Mott introduced Mr. Elmer Flores, a Special Education teacher that was in the audience and was being appointed this evening.

Comments, questions and concerns regarding agenda items only – Mr. Paul Gibson spoke specifically regarding the joint project with Hofstra; he introduced Mr. Jacobs; acknowledged being welcomed by the School Board and Faculty; thanked Gisselle Benitz-Rodriguez with her ability to get the job done; thanked the Board and Administration for accepting the project with Hofstra University; he analyzed the results and the importance of voting power.
