

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION UNIONDALE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, UNIONDALE, Nassau County, New York, was held in the Uniondale High School of said District on Tuesday October 2, 2018 at 5:00 PM.

PRESENT: Dr. Terri Mangum, President; Mr. Neville Georges, Vice President; and Mr. Justin Brown, Ms. Charmise Desire, Trustees.

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The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Dr. Mangum called the meeting to order at 5:00 PM.

Motion was made by Ms. Desire, seconded by Mr. Brown to go into executive session for the purpose of discussion of the employees' collective bargaining unit.

AT 7:00 PM. the Board reconvened in Open Session.

JROTC presented colors, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Dr. Mangum called the meeting to order.

### **ROUTINE MATTERS**

RESOLVED, the minutes of August 28, 2018 and September 25, 2018 were approved. (3 Ayes – 1 Nay - Mr. Georges)

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, motion was made by Mr. Justin Brown, seconded by Ms. Charmise Desire and approved unanimously the use of facilities by the Boy Scouts of America.

### **COMMENTS OF THE BOARD**

Dr. Mangum read a public statement regarding teacher negotiations.

Ms. Sanichara mentioned that she is in the process of planning to have a fair in the spring with all the schools, and she will keep the Board and the community informed.

All the Board members congratulated Ms. Alicia Boardman and Mr. Kornfield for their outstanding work. They also thanked Mrs. Kornfield for all of her assistance and devotion to the students.

Ms. Desire was pleased that Ms. Taylor and the Directors are moving into the future with the New Generations Standards. Hofstra University publishes a brochure "The Community Connection" and the current issue honors Uniondale TA, Ms. McFadden-Walker and Uniondale teacher, Mr. Charles Picone as well as Uniondale students for their Model Election program. The previous evening, Ms. Desire had attended a Nostrand Gardens Civic Assn. meeting and a Charter School presentation was made. It is important to note Nostrand Gardens stands behind Uniondale Schools, but we should be consistently reminding everyone of the excellent things happening in our schools. This is where we can best use our website. It should list what is happening in all of our schools. Also, recently at The Tilles Center, LI Arts Alliance-Performing Arts School honored public school students across the County who have excelled. Uniondale will be looking into this.

Mr. Brown is pleased that we are looking into so many programs to help our students excel. We are looking into software that will allow someone who is not able to attend the Board meetings to go into the privacy of their home, car, train, wherever they are, and read all about what is being discussed and planned. This will be beneficial not only to the Board Members but also to the community and the students.

Mr. Georges welcomed Ariana. He stressed the importance of having programs on curriculum as presented by Ms. Taylor and the Directors. He feels that the District should have an Assistant Principal at the High School for each Grade Level and that a Director for Elementary Education should be hired.

Dr. Mangum stated that Hofstra had a Safety Forum last week that the Board was unable to attend due to our own meeting. However, we sent a representative and we have some information. Some of the topics were Active Shooter overview and response; Stop the Bleed; Nassau County War on Opioid Abuse; Cyber Bullying; Patrol Officers visiting schools as part of their patrol; Nassau County Police conducting sight inspections; conducting classes on situational awareness; introducing and mandating the implementation of the Rave Program; Brief Situational awareness Presentation and Conducted and provided a demonstration of police response during an active shooter incident. These are important items and the community will be kept informed.
