

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Lloyd reviewed current security protocols and Dr. Edward Thomas, Uniondale High School Principal, spoke of additional items being stressed with the students

Mr. Jamal Scott gave a line by line review of the three components (Capital, Program and Administration) of the 2018-2019 budget. Changes are still being made.

COMMENTS BY THE BOARD

Ms. Campbell mentioned that the lunch lines are too long. She asked that this be looked into. She also asked about looking into a different venue for graduation so that students may be able to get more tickets for their families.

All the Board members thanked the community for their support of the bond. They are looking forward to this being a solution for the enrollment numbers and not having portable classrooms.

Many comments were based on the tragedy at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, FL and concern for the safety of all students. Dr. Mangum was at the High School at the time students planned to memorialize the 17 persons who were killed. Our students read poems, sang songs and some did walk around the property but she was very proud of their conduct. It is a very difficult time for everyone.

Approval to accept the Bond Resolution for Authorizing the construction, additions and improvements to all District buildings and sites.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE UNIONDALE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED MARCH 20, 2018, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADDITIONS, ALTERATIONS, AND IMPROVEMENTS TO ALL DISTRICT BUILDINGS AND SITES; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS NOT TO EXCEED \$158,134,456; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFORE; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$158,134,456 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

Recital

WHEREAS, at the Special District Meeting duly called and held on March 15, 2018, in the Uniondale Union Free School District, in the County of Nassau, New York (the "District"), a majority of the qualified voters present and voting approved a Bond Proposition authorizing the construction of additions, alterations, and improvement to all District buildings and sites, at the estimated total cost of not to exceed \$158,134,456; and the levy and collection of a tax to be collected in annual installments to pay the principal of and interest on the not to exceed \$158,134,456 serial bonds authorized to be issued;

Now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE UNIONDALE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Uniondale Union Free School District, in the County of Nassau, New York, is hereby authorized to construct additions, alterations, and improvements to all District buildings and sites, substantially as described in a report dated January 11, 2018, prepared for the District by H2M Architects + Engineers, including but not limited to: the construction of building additions and the reconstruction and reconfiguration of interior space to address enrollment and academic program needs; installation of air conditioning; replacement and improvements to heating, ventilation, electrical, plumbing, public address and mechanical systems; replacement and upgrade of roofs, windows, lockers and floors; renovations to facilitate access by the physically challenged; drainage, building envelope, masonry, pavement, asphalt, parking, curb and sidewalk improvements; and the construction of playground and athletic facility enhancements, including new synthetic turf fields, field lighting and new concession stand; all of the foregoing to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is not to exceed \$158,134,456 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of not to exceed \$158,134,456 serial bonds of the district, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the amount of not to exceed \$158,134,456 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law") to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the objects or purposes for which serial bonds are authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of all bonds herein and heretofore authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (c) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in "Newsday" and "The Uniondale Beacon", two newspapers of the District having a general circulation within the District and hereby designated the official newspapers for such publication.
