SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Lloyd introduced Mr. Dexter Hodge, Principal of Lawrence Road Middle School. Mr. Hodge welcomed the Board of Education, parents and administration. He introduced the newly formed Jazz Band who played a selection. Ms. Sumter, Assistant Principal of Lawrence Road Middle School, recognized ten students: 3-sixth graders, 3-seventh graders and 4- eight graders, for their academic success. Ms. Sumter introduced Dr. Ambika Nath, Uniondale Alum. She reflected on the opportunities that attending Uniondale afforded her. She was provided with multiple advanced curriculum's that helped further her education. Today she is a board-certified medical physician. Dr. Silverstein presented Dr. Kari-Lee Grant with an award of recognition.

Dr. Lloyd recognized and introduced the districts new administrative staff: Mr. Epstein, Assistant Superintendent for Business Affairs; Ms. Ritter, Director of Instructional Technology and Library Media Services; Mr. Saunders, UHS Assistant Principal; Mr. Argueta, UHS Dean; and Mr. Taufique, Technology Supervisor.

Dr. Lloyd recognized UHS scholars with high academic achievements who have attended Lawrence Road Middle School. Autumn Verbi thanked her teachers for helping guide her to where she is now. Juliane Jeffard reflected on the devotion of her teachers and the assurance they provided through her journey.

Dr. Lloyd congratulated Board President- Charmise Desiré, Board Trustee- Ms. Blanco-Harvey, and PTA Council President-Ms. Donna Jackson for the honor and awards they received for their service to the community.

Dr. Lloyd introduced Mr. Gibson, Co-Chairperson of the Bond Oversight Advisory Committee. Ms. Ford sent her regrets for being absent. The committee met on November 14th where they discussed the \$3.8m Smart School Preliminary plan. The committee has decided to divide the work of the schools as they get further into planning to allow for closer monitoring. The project is slightly behind schedule which leaves a chance for the plans cost to increase but the committee is doing everything to ensure they are back on track. The committee has also sent information to the board indicating their readiness for phase III to keep the project moving. The committee has also reviewed membership attendance and will make recommendations to the board about any changes that are needed.

COMMENTS BY THE BOARD

Ms. Jeffries reported that in collaboration with Dr. Thomas, UHS Principal, the cheerleaders have been able to arrange transportation to and from their training clinic. This training has allowed for improved stunts. The team has begun fundraising, she asked for everyone's support. Basketball season has arrived, both girls and boys are looking forward to making it to the playoffs this year, she asks that the community come out and support the teams- it is a great way to connect with students and staff. Herself and nine other students in the pre-nursing program had the opportunity to go to the Sandra Atlas Bass Center for Liver Disease and speak with surgeons and discuss their experiences in college and medical school. The pre-nursing students will be meeting with neurology professions on December 6th. The seniors received apparel free of charge due to mishaps that previously occurred with their orders. The senior class is looking forward to their class trip to Six-Flags. She recognizes the principals for listening to her about student concerns.

Carol Eason thanked everyone for attending and Lawrence Road for hosting. She congratulated the high achieving students as well as Ms. Blanco-Harvey and Desiré on their awards. She thanked Dr. Nath for coming. She had the opportunity to attend an event this weekend put together by Uniondale Alumni. It was an excellent event that provided a free basketball clinic, with a focus on mental health. It is wonderful to see our alumni are giving back; this is an initiative she encourages and hopes is supported.

Adelina Blanco-Harvey thanked everyone for attending. She thanked the newly formed jazz band who played this evening and the staff at Lawrence Road. She reflected on Dr. Silverstein

and admired her growing with the district. She recognized Dr. Nath from when she served on PTA. Herself and Dr. Nath were both presenters for career day at Lawrence Road. She is happy to see her giving back and thanked her for the continued support of the district. She thanked Dr. Lloyd for his attendance to the gala in which she was honored and the award he presented to her. He honored her with an award on behalf of the district. Charmise Desiré thanked everyone for their attendance. The last meeting at Grand Avenue, Mr. Georges was presented with a plaque for his dedication over the last 20 years. The plaque will be hung on the wall in the new addition Grand Avenue to remind generations to come of Mr. Georges foundation and contribution. She congratulated Ms. Blanco-Harvey for her recognition this weekend. She recognized the one-week old Jazz band that performed this evening, they represented well. She congratulated the scholars who were recognized on their accomplishments and hope they maximize on their resources within the district. Congratulations to Dr. Kari-Lee Grant for continuing to be a factor in the lives of children. Thank you to Dr. Nath for coming, it is something to be proud of. There are recent efforts where UHS administration brought students to Adelphi on black solidarity day to give exposure to programs on the college level. There were also Social Studies Teachers who took students to Hofstra to engage in Project 1619, recognizing the 400 years of slavery, students were able to get photos, free books and one on one time with distinguished lecturer speaker Eddie Glore. Ms. Desire discussed the increasing cost of higher education and it is important to exposing them to ways of earning income and help prepare them for the future.
