Launched in 1997 by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Healthfinder divides its links into four main categories: Health Library, Just for You, Health Care, and Directory of Healthfinder Organizations. In addition to links, the site offers current health news and a series of online checkups. Separate versions of Healthfinder are available for kids and Spanish-speaking consumers.

Summary Web Feet summary: Hosted by the Lung Association of Canada, this site offers useful information for students of all ages about the body's respiratory system and its role in maintaining our overall well-being. There are separate sections for students in grades 1 to 3, 4 to 6, and 7 to 12. The youngest students are introduced to their Body Buddies--the heart and lungs--and learn how they work together to keep us healthy. Older students will learn about what the breathing system looks like and how it works. All sections contain warnings against the dangers of smoking. A special section for teachers features ideas for classroom activities and resources for all grade levels.

Access to Health (NOAH) is a collaborative effort of the New York Public Library, New York Library Council, City University of New York, and the New York Academy of Medicine. Available in both English and Spanish, this database of professionally evaluated Web resources can be searched by keyword or browsed by health topic or subject. The index of health topics lists specific diseases and conditions, as well as such general resource categories as Surgery, Drugs and Medications, and Support Groups. The alphabetical index of subjects lists symptoms, health-related environmental topics, and parts of the body.

Summary Web Feet summary: This excellent site from the government of the United Kingdom has several subsites for different grade levels. The youngest students can find information geared toward them at Welltown (http://www.welltown.gov.uk/), which covers topics such as being active, eating health foods, growing up, keeping safe. and keeping clean. Galaxy H (http://www.galaxy-h.gov.uk/), for the next grade levels, has numerous interactive activities to teach children about various health topics. Included are games and quizzes on choosing healthy meals, designing a healthy school, being safe when out in the sun, avoiding everyday dangers, and much more. The site for the third level (or about ages 11 to 14) is LifeBytes (http://www.lifebytes.gov.uk/), which discusses physical activity, healthy eating, mental health, health conditions, alcohol and drugs, smoking, and more. The sites also include sections for teachers and for parents so they can learn how to help children use the sites plus a subsite for older students called Mind, Body & Soul (http://www.mindbodysoul.gov.uk/).

The bureau's official Web site offers a closer look at all its activities. You will find extensive information about ATF's core areas, including arson and explosives, in addition to alcohol, tobacco, and firearms. The site contains the full text of ATF enforced regulations, ATF publications, and the bureau's mostwanted list. A kids' section features resources on crime; ATF history and background; and information about gang resistance, firearms education, and related materials.
