

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

The Board of Education believes that positive parental involvement is essential to student achievement, and thus encourages such involvement in school educational planning and operations. Parental involvement may take place either in the classroom or during extra-curricular activities. The Board encourages parental involvement at home (e.g., planned home reading time, informal learning activities, and/or homework "contracts" between parents and children). The Board directs the Superintendent of Schools to develop a home-school communications program in an effort to encourage all forms of parental involvement.

Parental Involvement and Title I

For the purposes of meeting requirements of Title I, the following parental involvement procedures will be carried out at each school where Title I funds are used:

- a. Parents will be provided with information regarding the Title I program.
- b. Parents will be provided with school performance profiles.
- c. Parents will be provided with individual student results.
- d. Parents will be provided with descriptions and explanations of curriculum, assessments, and expected proficiency levels.
- e. Parents will be provided timely information and opportunities for regular meetings.
