

Tattnall County High School's 2018 Graduation Rate Exceeds State Graduation Rate

Today, the Georgia Department of Education released the 2018 graduation rates for public high schools across the state. The 2018 graduation rate for Tattnall County High School is 84.28%, which is higher than the state graduation rate of 81.6% and the TCHS 2017 graduation rate, which was 80.342%. Every subgroup of students exceeded the CCRPI Improvement Targets that were set by the state for Tattnall County High School.

The improvement in our graduation rate can be directly attributed to our committed staff members, beginning with our BOE members and Central Office personnel to each person who works in our schools and drives our buses. Everyone in the system understands that graduation is the goal for each student from PreK through 12th grade, and we all work diligently doing whatever it takes to help our students graduate and become productive citizens.

A special thank you also goes to our parents and community members who stress to our students the importance of obtaining a high school diploma.
