Recommended Motion #211 - 2016-2017 – LOMS Theater Arts Director Appointment:

Recommended Motion #213 - 2016-2017 - Supporting Adoption by Board of Regents of Amendment to Section 135.4 (c)(7) of the Commissioner’s Regulations Extending Selective Classification

Eligibility:

WHEREAS, Section 135.4 (c)(7) governs the eligibility and selective classification process for exceptional seventh and eighth grade students to participate in interscholastic sports at the Junior Varsity or Varsity High School level; and

WHEREAS, the current Regulation is ambiguous as to extending selective classification eligibility to seventh and eighth grade students who attend K-8 school districts; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents is considering adoption of a proposed amendment of Section 135.4 (c)(7) of the Commissioner’s Regulations to clarify that K-8 school districts may, under certain conditions, employ established selective classification protocol to allow its seventh and eighth grade exceptional athletes equal opportunity to participate in interscholastic sports at the high school(s) with which the K-8 school district contracts for the education of its high school age students; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education believes that the proposed amendment to the Commissioner’s Regulation is in the best interest of exceptional student athletes attending seventh or eighth grade in a K-8 school district because it will allow them the opportunity to participate, if eligible, at the Junior Varsity or Varsity level in the same manner as other exceptional student athletes attending seventh and eighth grade within a K-12 school district; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education sees no valid reason to deprive these exceptional student athletes of an opportunity to play at the high school level just because they attend a K-8 school district as opposed to a K-12 school district, particularly given the proposed amendments provision providing for a year of ineligibility if, following participation on a high school interscholastic team, the student chooses to attend a different high school with which the K-8 district contracts for the ninth grade school year.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that the Board of Education enthusiastically supports the proposed amendment to current Regulation 135.4 (c)(7) and respectfully urges the Board of Regents to adopt this amendment, at its earliest opportunity; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education respectfully requests the Board of Regents to consider adding language to the proposed amendment to Regulation so as to allow seventh and eighth grade students who are bona fide residents of a K-8 school district, but who attend private or parochial schools, eligibility for selective classification protocols in interscholastic sports at the Junior Varsity or Varsity level at the high school(s) with which the K-8 school district contracts for the education of its high school age students.
