CLASSROOM LEARNING TECHNOLOGY:

Acquire Learning Technology Equipment or Facilities (Devices)... including but not limited to interactive whiteboards, computer servers, desktop computers, laptops, tablet devices.

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NUFSD allocation is \$614,259.00

(\$670,759.00 original allocation -
\$56,500.00 private school allocation =
\$614,259.00)

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Funds will be expended in two phases. Each phase not to exceed \$307,129.50.

- Phase 1:
 - Technology to support the revision of the A. MacArthur Barr Middle School Media Center – interactive whiteboards, projection devices, electronic displays, Chromebooks and storage/charging carts.
 - Technology to increase learning opportunities for Nanuet Senior High School Students – Chromebooks and storage/charging carts for classrooms.

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Funds will be expended in two phases. Each phase not to exceed \$307,129.50.

 - Technology to increase learning opportunities for students in all school buildings – replacement of broken interactive whiteboards and projection units in specific classrooms and learning areas.

 - Technology to support the revision of the Nanuet Senior High School Media Center – interactive whiteboards, projection devices, electronic displays, Chromebooks and storage/charging carts.
 - Technology to increase learning opportunities for A. MacArthur Barr Middle School Students – Chromebooks and storage/charging carts for classrooms.

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Funds will be expended in two phases. Each phase not to exceed \$307,129.50.

- Phase 2 (continued):
 - Technology to increase learning opportunities for students in all school buildings – replacement of broken interactive whiteboards and projection units in specific classrooms and learning areas.

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Assumptions:

- School buildings will possess sufficient connectivity infrastructure to ensure that devices can be used during the school day.
- Sufficient infrastructure that meets the FCC's 100 Mbps per 1,000 students standard exists in buildings where new devices will be deployed in all buildings.

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Deliverables:

- **Managed Fiber Project** – completed Spring of 2015
Upgrade Switches and Wiring in all WCs to support 10GB speed building to building and closet to closet – completion date Spring 2016
- **Virtualize Servers** – completion date Spring 2016
- **Provide Wireless Connectivity for Personal Devices** – completion date Spring 2016

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Process:

- Board of Education approves Preliminary SSBA Plan
- Preliminary SSBA Plan is posted on Website for 30 days for feedback
- Board of Education Meeting is held to hear feedback (2 weeks prior notice to public)
- Board of Education approves Final SSBA Plan
- Final SSBA Plan is posted on Website



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
