Flossmoor School District 16 I Integrated Pest Management Program

In accordance with new Illinois State regulations, SMITHEREEN PEST MANAGEMENT will perform an Integrated Pest Management Program at School District 161.

Integrated Pest Management combines preventive techniques, non-chemical pest control methods, and the appropriate use of pesticides with preference for products that are the least harmful to human health and the environment.

Scheduled service to the schools in the district will be on the first Tuesday of each month between the hours 4pm and 11 pm. Holidays or vacations SMITHEREEN PEST MANAGEMENT will strive to maintain the day of service but will adjust the time to accommodate the custodial staff at each school.

SMITHEREEN PEST MANAGEMENT will provide the maintenance supervisor with written reports after each service of suggested preventive techniques and non-chemical pest control methods that should be performed by the maintenance or custodial staff.

The following is a list of baits that will be used during regular service. Use of baits for pest control does not require the school district to notify the public. No other chemicals will be used unless the maintenance supervisor is notified.

Contrac all weather bait
Avert ant and roach bait
Intruder HPX residual with cyflucthrin
Cy-kick cs
Maxforce roach bait gel

Baygon roach bait.

Final Block Rodenticide

upon notifying of the maintenance supervisor, other baits may be added.

If the baits listed above will not give satisfactory results, Priority Exterminating will contact the maintenance supervisor. During this meeting the most effective control methods will be discussed. If it is determined that chemical application is necessary, a date for application will be set. The School district must notify parents and guardians of students and employees who have registered to receive written notification prior to application of pesticides to school property. Priority Exterminating will provide M.S.D.S. sheets and labels for the chemical to be used.

Suggested action by school district,

- 1. Include the dates of exterminating services in the next printing of your school calendar.
- 2. Maintain at each school a written record of chemicals used at that school for one year.

Mandatory action to be taken by the school district:

School districts must maintain a registry of parents and guardians of students and employees who have registered to receive written notification prior to application of pesticides to school property.
