Policy IKEAB (Promotion Requirements, Farson-Eden Middle School)

**PROMOTION COURSE REQUIREMENTS
FARSON-EDEN MIDDLE SCHOOL**

1. The configuration for middle school will be grades sixth through eighth.
2. Sweetwater School District Number One requires that by the end of the eighth grade (8) year, students must ~~successfully~~ complete the following core **courses** ~~classes and earn 21 credits to be promoted to ninth (9) grade. A one semester class equals .5 credit. A blocked semester class equal 1.0 credit.~~
3. ~~Of these credits:~~

Five Credits (5) 6 semesters	Language Arts
Two and One Half Credits (2.5) 6 semesters	Math
Two and One Half Credits (2.5) 6 semesters	Social Studies
Two and One Half Credits (2.5) 6 semesters	Science
One Credit (1.0) 4 semesters	Physical Education
One Half Credit (.5) 1 semester	Health
One Half Credit (.5) 1 semester	Keyboarding Consumer Economics

3. **All 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students must maintain full-time status.**
4. Should problems become apparent for any individual students, the district will utilize required procedures to consider extenuating circumstances (ie...illness, IEP, etc.) which may warrant adjustment to the above requirements.
5. ~~Students short promotion requirements will be required to make up deficit credits. Ninth grade students who are deficient in two or less required middle school classes will be allowed to enrolled in high school. They may participate in high school activities and their four years of high school eligibility through WHSAA will begin. Students who, at any time during the 6th, 7th, or 8th grade year, do not meet requirements of the curriculum shall be recommended for assistance through Farson-Eden interventions or other options available.~~
6. ~~Students with more than two middle school classes to make up will be considered second year eighth graders. They may take 9th grade classes if needed to fill their schedule but will be considered eighth graders and will not participate in high school activities. Communication with at-risk 6th, 7th, or 8th graders, their parents, and counselor will occur for students who are in danger of not completing required courses. The communication will review attempts made to help the student succeed and strategize future efforts to complete all necessary requirements.~~
