Sweetwater County School District #1 will create and foster academic success through partnerships with its schools, community and families.

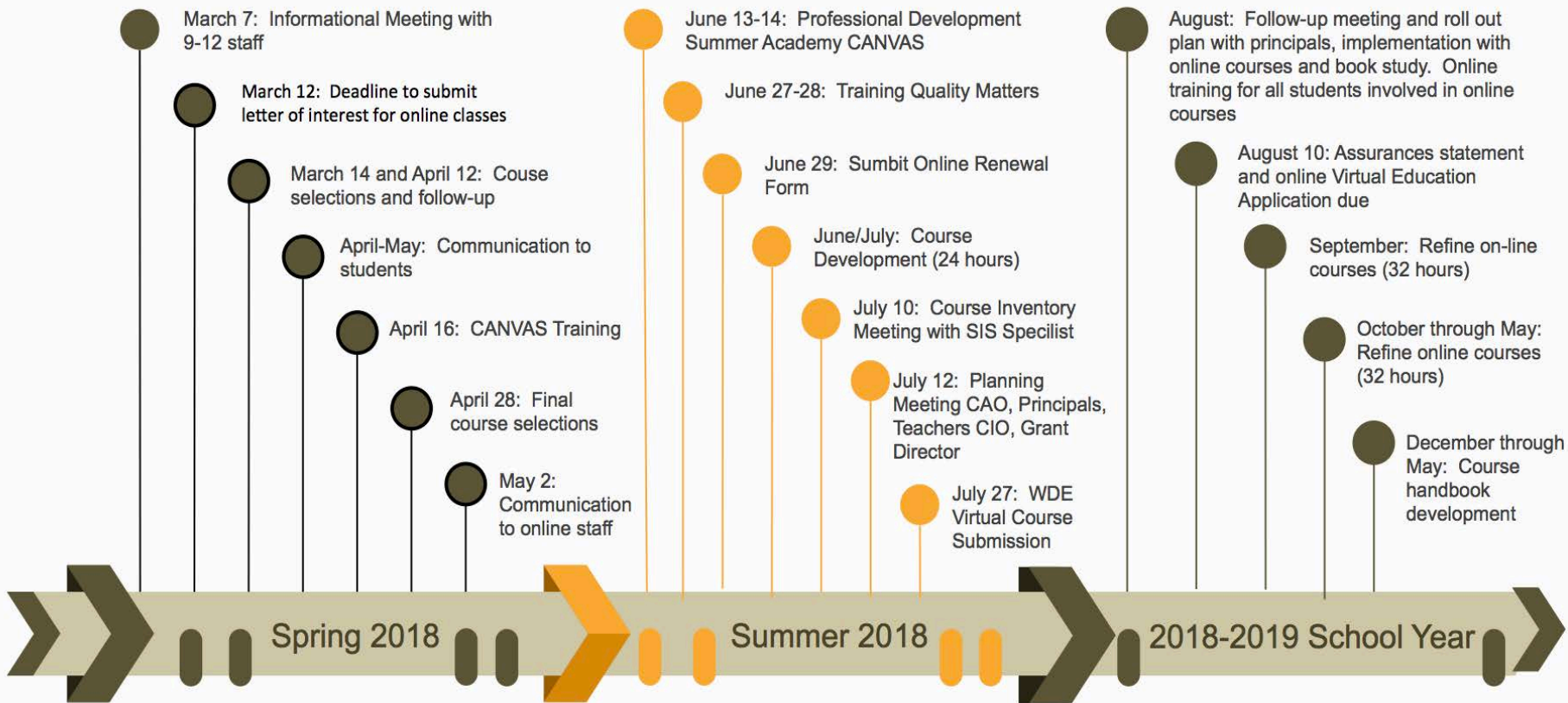
