- A. **RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District hereby adopts a budget of \$96,074,468 for the 2017-2018 school year, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby adopts the corresponding School District Budget Notice as required by New York State, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said budget is submitted for approval to the voters of this district at the Annual Election to be held on Tuesday, May 16, 2017.

- B. **RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District extend the lease agreement with the Japanese Educational Institute for the 2017-2018 school year based on the January 2017 Consumer Price Index for a total rental amount of \$147,998; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Board of Education is authorized to execute said agreement.

- C. **BOND RESOLUTION OF THE PORT CHESTER-RYE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED APRIL 20, 2017, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND ALTERATIONS TO DISTRICT SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND/OR SITES, STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$79,950,000, APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$79,950,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.**

WHEREAS, at the Special District Meeting duly called and held on March 28, 2017, in the Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District, in the County of Westchester, New York, a majority of the qualified voters present and voting approved the Bond Proposition authorizing the Board of Education to construct improvements and alterations to District school buildings and and/or sites, at the estimated total cost of \$79,950,000, and to levy and collect a tax to be collected in annual installments to pay the principal of and interest on the serial bonds authorized to be issued;
Now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PORT CHESTER-RYE UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District, in the County of Westchester, New York (herein called "District"), is hereby authorized to undertake a building and site improvement project, substantially as described in a plan prepared by the District with the assistance of Fuller and D'Angelo, P.C., Architects and Planners, consisting of the construction of improvements and alterations to District school buildings and/or sites, including (as and where required): the construction of building additions to provide for new classroom, gymnasium, office, and other space; interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration; the installation of elevators; site improvements, including parking, playground, and retaining wall enhancements; and athletic and recreation improvements, including the construction and/or installation of new playing fields; bleachers, concession stand and press box; all of the foregoing to include all original equipment, furnishings, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$79,950,000 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$79,950,000 serial bonds of the District to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$79,950,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness of the class of objects or purposes for which said serial bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in "The Journal News," and "The Westmore News," two newspapers each having a general circulation in the District and hereby designated the official newspapers of said District for such publications.

- D. **RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education of the Port Chester-Rye Union Free School District authorize the use of \$810,027 Capital Fund Unallocated Fund Balance to offset the borrowing for the \$79,950,000 capital project. The amount to be borrowed will be \$79,139,973.

Further, if the classroom teacher receives an ineffective composite or overall rating in the final year of the probationary period he/she shall not be eligible for tenure at that time, in which case the Board of Education, in its discretion, may extend the teacher's probationary term for an additional year.**
