Regular Meeting Minutes
Port Chester High School

Present: Board of Education Trustees: Carolee Brakewood, Thomas Corbia, Jim Dreves, and Robert Johnson

Mrs. Brakewood called the meeting to order at 7:02. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

PRESIDENTS OPENING REMARKS

Mrs. Brakewood apologized on behalf of Ms. Capeci who was unable to attend the meeting. Mrs. Brakewood introduced Dr. Klizus who read resolution A and presented the recognition certificates to the students.

Senator George Latimer spoke briefly regarding the status of the state budget.

Mrs. Brakewood thanked Senator Latimer for his efforts in advocating for Port Chester Schools.

One World Youth Club presented the launch of "Send a Net Save a Life" program in Africa to prevent Malaria. The mission is to raise \$500 to save 50 lives.

Mrs. Brakewood thanked the students and introduced Dr. Klizus who presented the budget update.

2014-2015 Budget Presentation

Estimated revenues and proposed expenditures were presented by Dr. Klizus. Final budget numbers to be announced the week of March 30th 2014.

Ms. McAward presented a live demonstration on the www.portchesterschools.org website for residents to see their estimated property taxes for the 2014 – 2015 school budget.

Mrs. Brakewood asked for Public Comment

Public Comment

Robert Reiss of 70 Munson Street thanked the BOE for a very thorough budget presentation and expressed his support by saying "Yes" to the budget.

Tom Ceruzzi of Port Chester was happy to see the decrease in school taxes and presented ideas for the increased enrollment in our schools.

Mr. Ceruzzi noted that during the prior week he had asked students he saw in the street 4 questions and was disappointed most students did not know the answers to his questions.

Elise Lemire of Lafayette Drive identified herself as a 17 year Professor at Purchase College; she spoke about her experience teaching English Literature. Mrs. Lemire is an advocate of the arts and expressed the importance of it in our schools. The students in her class who consistently achieve are those with involvement in the arts. She asked the Board to maintain the arts within our schools.

Dan Tellup wants more to be done in our schools.

Carmen Kochevsky 219 Cleveland Street described herself as a supporter of the budget. Ms. Kochevsky believes strong schools equals strong real estate. She also believes in accountability from the board. She would like to see more programs and fewer cuts.

Elizabeth Rotfeld of 105 Betsy Brown Road identified herself as a lifelong resident and parent to a King Street student. Mrs. Rotfeld addressed rumors in regards to the tax money being returned to the taxpayer and not the students with additional programs that were lost through the years. Mrs. Rotfeld pleaded for any additional state aide go directly to our schools as was requested to Albany.

Marianne Albertell President of the CSEA and Virginia Ellis President of the Teachers Union stood together to represent the unions and gave a summary of past budgetary concerns and compared it to present day. The students and schools can no longer be underfunded by the state.

Steve Simmons of North Regent Street identified himself as a parent of two Port Chester students; he addressed his budget concerns and development in the village that would have an impact in our schools. Community members need to continue to advocate for our schools.

Mary Strauch of Glendale Place identified herself as a parent of two Port Chester students and a strong advocate of improving our schools; she expressed her continued support for the school budget. Mrs. Strauch said she would like to see more sports programs and see the swim team continue.

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Pat Swift Principal of PCMS and President of the Port Chester Schools Administrators and Supervisors Association commended the Board of Education and thanked the Board for what they do on a daily basis. He invited everyone to visit Port Chester Middle School.

Wendy Sabjos of Port Chester and a parent to two children in Port Chester Schools expressed how hard it is to pay for afterschool care and would like to see more in our schools.

Mrs. Brakewood closed public comment and moved to Board of Education comments addressing the budget.

Mr. Corbia thanked the residents of Port Chester for speaking. Mr. Corbia wants to see the swim program and Intel science program in the budget. Mr. Corbia will not support 1 academic cut.

Mr. Johnson was very pleased with the support from the community. Mr. Johnson will not vote to give money back to the taxpayers and feels very strongly in giving it back to the students. Mr. Johnson addressed Mr. Ceruzzi's questioning students and compared it to a Harvard questioning process whereas the Harvard graduates had the same results.

Mr. Dreves supports the budget. There is no reason for the budget "not" to pass. This is the first time in a very long time the taxes will go down. Those who came to speak during Public Comment made an impact on Mr. Dreves and he thanked the public for doing that.

Ms. Brakewood thanked everyone for coming out to speak and expressed her support for the budget.

Upon motion by Mr. Dreves and seconded by Mr. Johnson and carried the meeting was adjourned at 10:13 pm.
