Students must also successfully pass the New York State Regents Examination in Comprehensive English, Global History and Geography, US History and Government, Integrated Algebra, and a Laboratory Science

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Additional Information

Juniors and seniors have an opportunity to attend the Adirondack Educational Center for half of the school day. Career and Technical Education courses include: Automotive Technology, Building Trades/Carpentry, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Health Occupations, Natural Resource Conservation and New Vision Health Program.

In addition, dual-credit courses are offered in cooperation with North Country Community College:

French IV (FRE102), Digital Photography (ART245), Introduction to Pottery (ART155), Drawing CC (ART 101), Paint CC (ART203)

Class Period: 40 minutes in length, meeting five times weekly

In addition to the daily class period, Regents science courses have a laboratory period twice weekly.
