

•Special Education

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The Winona-Montgomery Consolidated School District serves eligible students with disabilities ages 3-21. Eligibility categories include: Language/Speech, Developmentally Delayed, Specific Learning Disabilities, Intellectually Disabled, Autism, Orthopedically Impaired, Other Health Impaired, Hearing Impaired, Visually Impaired, Emotional Disabilities, Traumatic Brain Injuries, and Multiple Disabilities. As required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, students with disabilities are served in their Least Restrictive Environment (LRE). The WMCS D offers a wide spectrum of placement options based on individual student needs as determined by the IEP committee. This spectrum ranges from services in the general education classroom to more restrictive settings.

Three graduation options are available to students with disabilities as they enter high school:

- 1) a traditional diploma earning Carnegie Units;
- 2) the Mississippi Occupational Diploma which prepares them to enter the workforce or community college upon completion;
- 3) a Certificate of Completion based on the IEP of the individual student.
