SWBOCES Annual Meeting to be conducted remotely via Zoom

Public to have opportunity to observe 2020-21 proposed budget presentation and hear from Board of Education candidates

Assistant Superintendent for Business and Administrative Services Steve Tibbetts will lay out the \$12.04 million administrative budget, which reflects a 0.87% increase in day-to-day expenses and a 3.76% increase in post-employment benefits to 570 retirees. The capital budget of \$3.32 million reflects a 1.22% increase. The combined Administrative and retiree budget-to-budget increase amounts to 2.64%.

Meeting attendees will also hear from those seeking election to the Board of Education, incumbent Sheryl Brady of White Plains, and candidate Valarie D. Williams of New Rochelle. Component district school boards will vote on the SWBOCES budget and board candidates April 21.

Historically, the Annual Meeting has been attended in-person by SWBOCES leadership and representatives of the 32 component school districts at the Career Services campus in Valhalla, where it serves as a showcase for high school students studying Culinary Arts.
