#### AP WORLD HISTORY

**Pre-requisite:** Global History I, Pre-AP Assignment, and Departmental Approval.

This is a challenging, college-level history course, aligned with the expectations of College Board. The course focuses on developing students' abilities to think conceptually about world history and apply historical thinking skills as they learn about the past. AP World History encompasses the history of the five major geographical regions of the globe: Africa, the Americas, Asia, Europe, and Oceania, with special focus on historical developments and processes that cross multiple regions.

Students must demonstrate the ability to analyze primary and secondary source readings, and to combine historical research with analytical essay writing skills. The Social Studies Department has developed a selection process, in order to allow students to make evident their abilities and interest in history.



## **AP World History**

Students interested in taking AP World History, and who are currently in Global 9, must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1- Have an average of **88 or higher**, in their current Global History class, as measured by their first and second Quarter final grades.
- 2- Before **February 15th**, inform current Global 9 teacher of interest in taking AP World History, and ask teacher via e-mail, to complete **Teacher Evaluation Form**. Teachers will submit this form directly to the Department Chair, and comment on areas such as self-motivation, interest in Social Studies, ability to articulate ideas and opinions, written communication skills and critical thinking skills.
- 3- Review "Expectations and Requirements Contract for AP World". Collect required signatures. (Student, parent, counselor).
- 4- Complete and submit *Pre-AP World Assignment*. Submit on Google Classroom **BEFORE** March 7th. (Approximately 3 hours). **GC:** ruukyyf

### **AP World History**

- 5- Submit a folder to Ms. Fama, in the Social Studies Office, Room 360A, containing the following documents:
  - Copy of graded *Enduring Issues Essay* given as part of the Ninth Grade Midterm Exam. Student will submit a copy of this specific essay, after his/her Global 9 teacher grades it. Essay will be reviewed for higher analytical thinking, understanding of content, and reading and writing skills.
  - "Expectations and Requirements Contract for AP World History" containing all signatures. (\*Distributed by teacher)
  - Folders will be submitted between February 28th and and March 15th.

Department Chair and teachers will review the application of all students, in order to collaboratively determine which students have demonstrated to have the ability to successfully enroll in AP World History. Students will be informed by **April 22, 2019**.

Students who do not meet the minimum GPA requirements, or may not have demonstrated to have the necessary skills to successfully complete the AP World History Class, may appeal directly to the Social Studies Department Chair.

### "Expectations and Requirements for AP World History"

Students in this course will be especially selected for their demonstrated ability and interest in history. It is expected that they have the capability to do more advanced work, and understand that:

- Students wishing to enroll in AP World History must accurately complete a pre-AP World
   Assignment. \*(Completion does not guarantee acceptance, however, failure to complete will prevent acceptance to the class).
- Students enrolled in AP World History are expected to spend an average of SEVEN hours per week, doing homework and other content related activities.
- Students enrolled in AP World History are expected to complete a Summer and a Spring
  assignment, which require written responses, significant reading, and usually take an average of 10
  hours per assignment.



## AP United States History

### **AP U.S. History**

AP U.S. History is designed to be the equivalent of a two-semester introductory college or university U.S. history course. In AP U.S. History students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes in nine historical periods from approximately 1491 to the present. Students develop and use the same skills, practices, and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical comparisons; and utilizing reasoning about contextualization, causation, and continuity and change over time. The course also provides seven themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places: American and national identity; migration and settlement; politics and power; work, exchange, and technology; America in the world; geography and the environment; and culture and society.

### **Selection Process for AP U.S. History**

Prerequisite: Global History II & Departmental Approval

Required Standardized Assessments: The NYS Regents Exam and the AP United States

History Exam

The Social Studies Department has developed a selection process, in order to allow students to make evident their abilities and interest in US history. It is assumed that selected students have the capability to do more advanced work.

Special attention will be given to AP Potential recommendation, based on student's performance on their PSAT.



### **Selection Process for AP U.S. History**



Students interested in taking AP U.S. History, and who are currently in Global 10 or AP World History, must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1- Have an average of **85 or higher**, in their current Global Studies class, or **80 or higher** in their AP World History class, as measured by their first and second quarter final grades.
- 2- Before **February 15**, inform current Global 10 or AP World teacher via e-mail of interest in AP U.S. History, and ask him/her to complete *Teacher Evaluation Form*. Teacher will submit this form directly to the Department Chair. Teachers will comment on areas such as self-motivation, interest in Social Studies, intellectual curiosity, ability to articulate ideas and opinions, written communication skills, and critical thinking skills.

### **Selection Process for AP U.S. History**

- 3- Review "Expectations and Requirements Contract for AP U.S. History", and collect required signatures. (Student, parent, counselor). To be distributed by current teacher
- 4- Submit a folder to Ms. Fama, in the Social Studies Office, Room 360A, containing the following documents:

Global 10 Students: Copy of graded *Enduring Issues Essay* - Midterm. AP World: DBQ graded essay on *Influenza* OR *Imperialism in Africa*.

Student will submit a copy of specific essay, after his/her Global 10 or AP World teacher grades it. Essay will be reviewed for higher analytical thinking, understanding of content, and reading and writing skills.

- "Expectations and Requirements - Contract for AP U.S. History" containing all signatures.

Students will submit folder between February 28th and March 15th.

#### "Expectations and Requirements for AP U.S History"

Students in this course will be especially selected for their demonstrated ability and interest in history. It is expected that they have the capability to do more advanced work, and understand that:

- Students enrolled in AP USH are expected to spend an average of 10 hours weekly, doing homework and other content related activities.
- Students enrolled in AP USH are expected to complete a **Summer assignment** which requires extensive reading and usually takes an average of **15-20 hours**.
