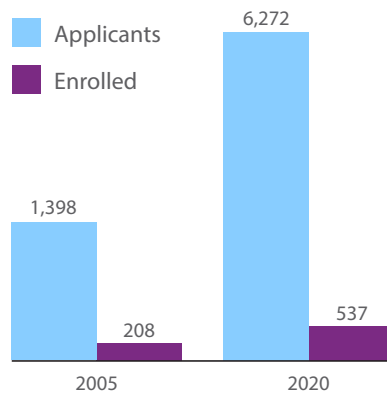
Macaulay scholars enroll as undergraduates in one of eight CUNY senior colleges and take additional courses designed to build critical thinking skills.

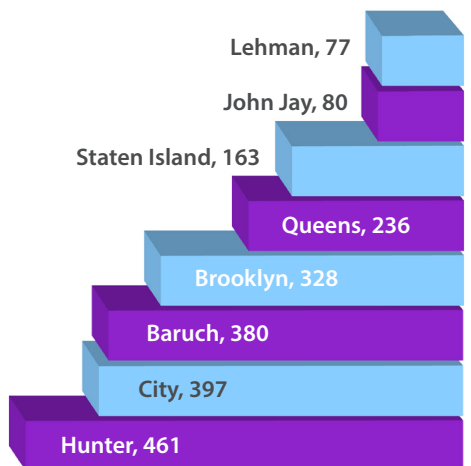
