William R. Elliott, Jr. Scholarship Guidelines

The William R. Elliott, Jr. Memorial Scholarship, sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Hopewell, is available to seniors at Hopewell High School and Prince George High School who will attend a college or university. The Scholarship award is a one time award of \$1,500 and is paid directly to the school to which the recipient will attend.

BACKGROUND:

The William R. Elliott, Jr. Memorial Scholarship was established in 2018 by the Kiwanis Club of Hopewell to honor the memory of William R. Elliott, Jr., known to friends and family as "Bill". Mr. Elliott was a proud 1959 graduate of Hopewell High School where he was active in several sports and school clubs. Following graduation, Bill attended Virginia Tech and, upon graduating, went on to a career in public and private accounting. A long career with Media General gave him opportunities to serve in many financial management capacities in the newspaper and cable television industry. Mr. Elliott retired to Prince George County and became a Kiwanian in 2008 where he eventually served as President of the Hopewell Club and Lt. Governor of District 10. Through his leadership, the Key Clubs at Hopewell High and Prince George High schools were formed. He was very active in our community and in foreign and domestic church missions to Mexico, Colombia, SA, and Belize and in several States.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS MUST:

1. Submit a completed application form.
2. Submit evidential documentation of acceptance to a college or university to which you will attend as a full time student and for which the scholarship will be used.
3. Submit the following materials/information for consideration by the Kiwanis Club of Hopewell. Applicants receive points in each area as shown below for a maximum cumulative total of 30 points.
 - a. Describe your financial need. (See application). (5 points)
 - b. Academic: (5 points)
 - i. Submit a copy of all high school transcripts including Class Rank and Grade Point Average.
 - ii. (Optional) Submit a copy of your SAT/ACT scores.
4. Provide a list and description of extracurricular activities, community service activities and awards. (See application). (10 points)
5. Provide a brief essay regarding your personal goals, your planned career pursuits and where you see yourself in 20 years. (See application). (10 points)

Deadline: Applications must be returned to the guidance office by April 2, 2020.
