Jessica Ann Moore Foundation will honor the memories of Mr. George (Larry) Taylor (**For Sussex Central High School, Sussex, VA Scholars (ONLY)**), Mrs. Olivia Taylor, Miss Kiimorah White, and Ms. Barbara Moore by awarding a scholarship in each of their names.

The goal of these four scholarships is to make financial awards to the most deserving scholars. Decisions are made by a selection panel and are based on the whole-person concept.

All applicants must be in their senior year of high school and plan to attend, or continue their education in an accredited American college/university or a vocational technical institution on a full time basis. The school must be a degree or certificate granting institution.

Additionally, applications must be postmarked no later than May 1, 2020 in order to be considered for scholarships offered. Award will be announced no later than May 6, 2020. Scholarship distributions will be presented at the 10th Annual Jessica Ann. Moore Foundation Scholarship Banquet on May 16, 2020 at the Jessica A. Moore Community Center, 408 School Street, Waverly, VA. 23890.

Check will be made payable to the school and the scholarship recipient.

Students in Grades 12 who will be attending college in the fall.

Transcript showing GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

National Test Scores, SAT = 900, Act = 18, and PSAT 800. (This includes all test)

Typewritten essay of 500 words. Topic is stated below on page 11.
