Re: Annual Colonel Ellis Memorial Scholarship and Essay Contest

Dear Guidance Counselor/Student Advisor,

The Camp 124 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War is proud to announce once again the availability of the Colonel Augustus van Horne Ellis Memorial Annual Scholarship and Essay Contest which has now been expanded to include the eastern side of the lower Hudson River Valley. The contest is open to all High School Seniors in the lower Hudson Valley. One scholarship will be awarded to help pay for books or other expenses for post secondary education or military service. The scholarship is \$250.00 and will be awarded each Memorial Day to the high school senior who demonstrates high academic achievement, a record of performance in school and community activities, an interest in the heritage of the United States, a letter of recommendation from either a school counselor, teacher or a responsible person in the community and a 500 word essay on a topic selected annually by the Colonel Ellis Camp. All applications, essays and recommendations must be postmarked no later than April 15th and mailed to the address listed on the enclosed application. Winners will be announced on Memorial Day and notified by mail with a copy to the school. All submissions shall become the property of the Ellis Camp 124, SUVCW, Department of New York. Past years winners have come from Suffern, Saugerties, Fallsburg, Chester, Nanuet, Valley Central, Pine Bush, Sullivan West and Pearl River High Schools. Last year's winner was Mr. Harrison Garcia of Clarkstown High School.

Colonel Ellis was the commander of the 124th New York Volunteer Infantry and was killed leading his men in the vicinity of Devils Den at Gettysburg on July 2, 1863.

The Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War is a fraternal, patriotic and educational organization chartered by Act of Congress (Title 36 U.S.C. sections 200301 et seq.) and is made up of males who are descendants of soldiers, sailors or members of the Revenue Cutter Service who honorably served the Union during the American Civil War.
