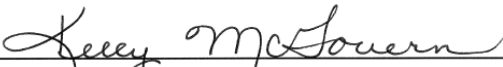

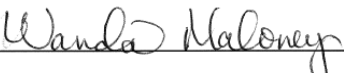

## Needs Assessment

1. Based on all Sweetwater#1 school state and federal accountability reports, which area(s) (growth, equity, achievement, graduation rate, participation rate etc....) is the lowest for your district?

### WAEA Reports

*The lowest indicator for Sweetwater #1 schools is achievement. The School Performance Reports for Sweetwater #1 indicate that seven schools are below target in the achievement category.*

### ESSA Reports

- *11 of the 17 schools are average or above in Growth*
- *7 of the 12 schools rated on Equity are average or above*
- *11 of the 17 schools are average or above in the English Learner category*
- *All schools met the WAEA and ESSA participation rate (95%) requirement*

2. Which schools are partially or not meeting expectations on the WAEA School Performance Report?

*The schools partially meeting expectations are Desert Elementary and Desert View Elementary. The schools not meeting expectations are Rock Springs High School, Westridge Elementary, Northpark Elementary, Farson-Eden Middle School and Eastside Elementary.*

3. Which schools are partially or not meeting expectations on the ESSA School Performance Report?

*Eastside Elementary has been identified on the ESSA report for Targeted Support and Improvement for their IEP subgroup performance. Black Butte High School has been identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement for their graduation rate.*

4. What other data sources could give you more information about this area of need? What is that additional data telling you needs the most attention?

*On the WY-TOPP state assessment, the district scored below the state average in 4<sup>th</sup> grade, 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 6<sup>th</sup> grade, 9<sup>th</sup> grade and 10<sup>th</sup> grade in ELA. In Math, 4<sup>th</sup>*

*grade, 5<sup>th</sup> grade, 6<sup>th</sup> grade, 7<sup>th</sup> grade, 9<sup>th</sup> grade and 10<sup>th</sup> grade scored below the state average. In Science, 4<sup>th</sup> grade and 10<sup>th</sup> grade scored below the state average.*

*The ACT data at 11<sup>th</sup> grade indicates that in the category of all students, many are scoring below the state average in English, Reading, Math, Science and on the composite score as well.*

*The 9<sup>th</sup> grade credits earned data at all three high schools reflect a below target classification on the WAEA School Performance Reports.*

*On the secondary schools ESSA reports, one school of the three secondary schools is at or above the 15-year graduation goal of 88%. No secondary schools are at or above target (47%) in Math and only one school is at or above target (43%) in ELA. No schools are at or above target (59%) of English Learners who met their annual progress goal for English Language Proficiency (ELP).*

*On the elementary ESSA reports, five of the ten schools are at or above target (59%) in the ELP progress category. Three of thirteen schools are rated at or above target in ELA (59%) and Math (57%) proficiency.*

*The 2017-2018 climate survey of high school students in Sweetwater #1 is given every fall. The biggest concerns from the survey are:*

- *Students at this school help each other even if they are not friends.*
  - *59% of students disagree or strongly disagree*
- *Students at this school treat property with respect.*
  - *63% of students disagree or strongly disagree*
- *Students at this school treat staff with respect.*
  - *53% of students disagree or strongly disagree*
- *Students at this school treat each other with respect.*
  - *64% of students disagree or strongly disagree*
- *Teachers at this school do not let students give up when the work gets hard.*
  - *38% of students disagree or strongly disagree*
- *Staff works hard at this school to make sure that students stay in school.*
  - *34% of students disagree or strongly disagree*

## GOAL #1: Achievement

The district will increase student achievement by implementation of newly adopted resources, validated curriculum maps, and implementation of district assessment system. All students will achieve at high levels with an increase of 10% in reading, math and science on the spring 2019 WY-TOPP summative assessment. For example, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students currently performing at 51.5% will increase to 61.5%.
