

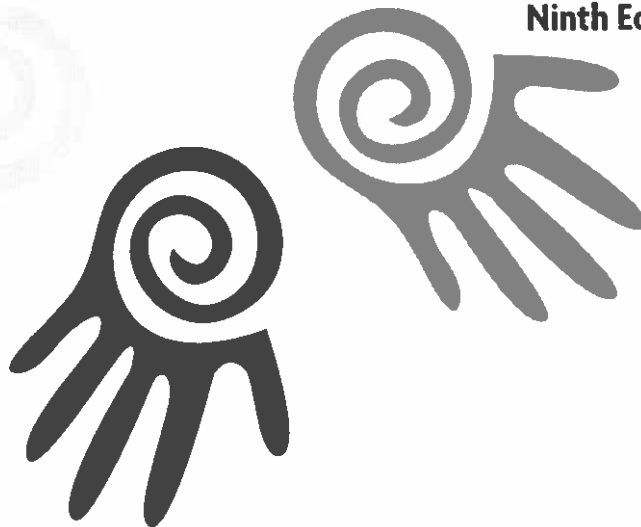

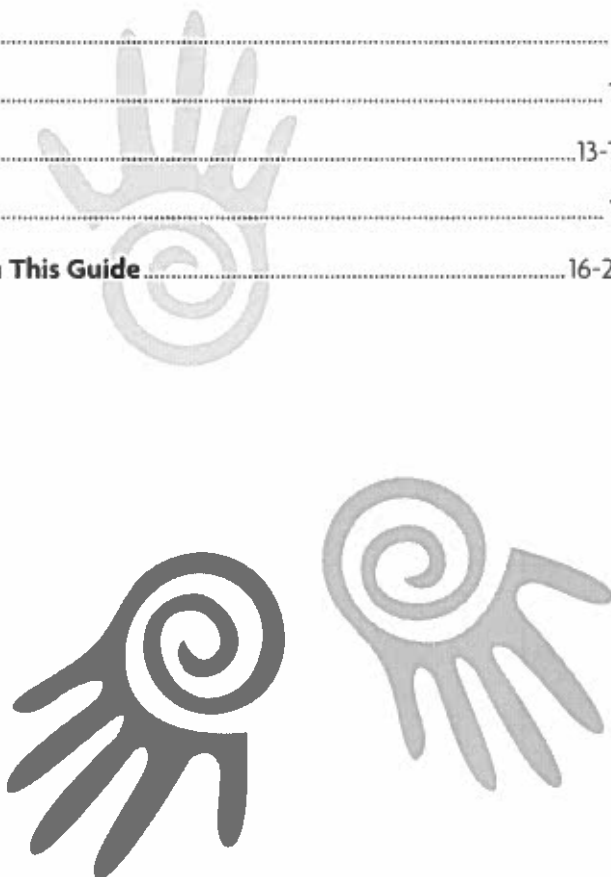

Assistive Technology is the use of a device defined as "any item, piece of equipment, or product system, whether acquired commercially off-the-shelf, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities". As students with disabilities move into the transitional phase of their high school years, they may be referred to ACCES-VR (formerly VESID) or NYS-CB for further vocational services. These services include, but are not limited to, vocational assessment, career counseling, job training and placement, and further education. 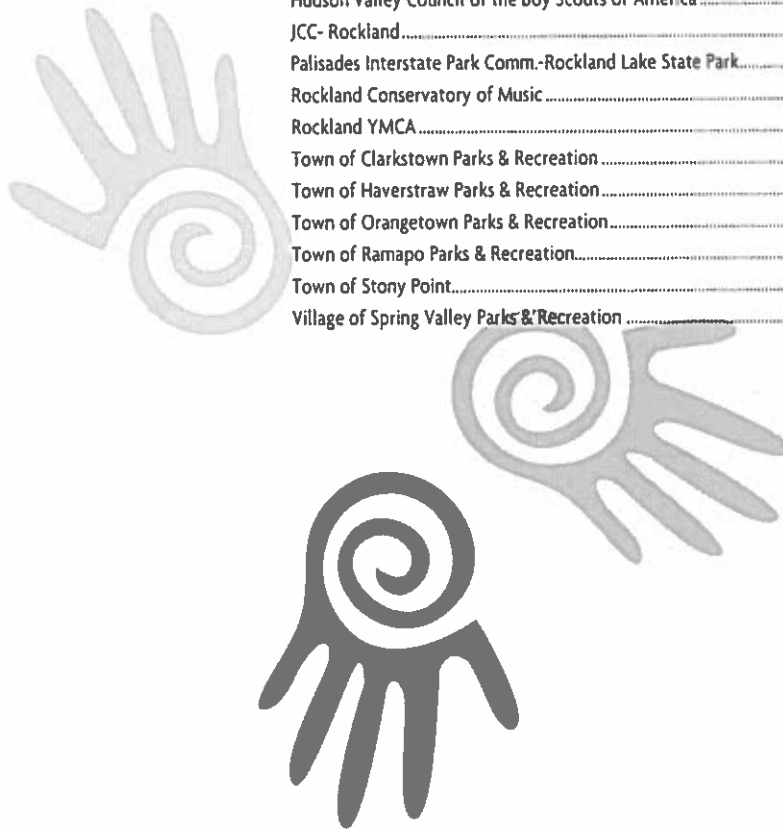
