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Writing the Narrative

You will need to include a short "narrative" for the show that will be used to introduce you and your design. To help with the narrative, think about the framing questions below. First Drafts are Due by February 24, 2020. Final Revised Drafts are due by March 9, 2020.

WHAT?

Tell us about your costume by describing what your outfit represents and how it relates to the theme.

SO WHAT? Why did you choose this idea for your outfit? Why is this a problem and who does it affect?

NOW WHAT? What can we do? What possible solutions are there for this issue/problem/theme? What can we do differently? What can we Change?

MATERIALS USED. Let us know the materials you used in your outfit. Remember to use available or recycle materials in your project.

Example of Waste Narrative Theme

What? What is waste and where does it come from?

So What? Why is it a problem who does it affect?

Now What? What can we do differently?

Jade represents waste and consumption. Everywhere she goes and everything she buys people give her a shopping bag. These bags sometimes find its way in our water system and hurt our animals. Next time Jade will say "no thanks" to plastic bags. Jade used about 50 plastic bags she collected to make her dress.
