3. CEP – Work

Summarized the progress made to-date each of the CEP goals
Prior to updating the CEP in iPlan portal, some analysis of lesson plans and student work must be completed for a few of the goals. Currently it appears that 4 of the 5 goals will be met.

4. PAF – Orton-Gillingham based: Looking to bring continuity to phonics, spelling and early grade writing

Preventing Academic failure (PAF) is an OG based phonic, reading and writing program that a few staff members have been trained in. We may decide to utilize this program next school year, either across the early grades or with select classes for our early grade phonics program to replace the various program currently in use. This may lead to better continuity of instruction in the early grade levels. Professional Development will be given to the entire teaching staff in June.
