## Programs

### Adult High School Credit Diploma Program (AHSCDP)

As part of the Norwich Regional Adult Education Cooperative, students from cooperative towns are able to take classes to earn credits towards a high school diploma. The AHSCDP program works with students in their last year of school on transitions skills to college and/or post-secondary training. Students are given a career assessment inventory and meet with a career developer to develop an individualized career plan. The transitions classes are focused on building college preparation skills such as writing a college essay, mock interviews, and preparation for the Accuplacer exam.

### Citizenship Preparation

Adults who wish to become American citizens will be given the necessary books and assistance to help prepare for the U.S. Naturalization Examination.

### Nursing Assistant Program (CNA)

Three Rivers Community College and Norwich Adult Education are partnering to provide support for Adult Ed students enrolled in one of the high school completion programs, who will attend the CNA program at Three Rivers Community College.

### GED® Test Prep Classes

These classes are designed for adult learners who feel that they can demonstrate high school level skills on a four-part, computer-based exam. Solid reading skills are required to pass the exam. Teachers will work with you to review reading, writing, math, and computer skills. Classes are offered to prepare you to take the GED® Exam. By passing four tests in the areas of Reasoning through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science, and Social Studies, you can earn a CT State High School Diploma.

### English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

Adult Education courses in ESOL teach limited-English speakers to read, write, speak, and understand English. ESOL programs target non-English speaking immigrants who need better English skills to become active members of the community, to prepare for employment or job advancement, or to take an active role in their children's education. We are also offering ESOL classes for more **advanced** students, where English instruction and work-force readiness are provided. Students have the opportunity to prepare for and obtain the Customer Service and Sales Certificate. Students work on employability skills such as resume writing, interviewing, job searching, and filling out job applications, etc.

### Adult Basic Education (ABE)

Students who need help with basic reading, writing, and math skills will be provided with pre-GED materials in small classes at the American Job Center in Montville, CT.

### Jobs, Employment, and Training Program (JET)

This program is offered to eligible students ages 17-24, and offers them the opportunity to earn a Customer Service and Sales Certificate, as well as job coaching and paid internships.

### National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

This program is recommended for adults (usually over age 21) who are highly motivated, mature, and self-directed, who have occupational skills and have acquired life skill experiences. The program features flexibility and confidentiality. Before enrolling, you must take a reading, writing, and math assessment. There is no classroom time connected to the NEDP. We have recently added tutors to the program to assist individual students with academic and technology skills.

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
