Physical Education	<p>Physical education programming at HCCS is divided into five main activities: Health Related Fitness, Individual Athletic Activities, Team Physical Activities, Dance, and Cooperative Games</p> <p>Students must demonstrate competency in a variety of physical activities (games, sports, exercises) that provide conditioning for each fitness area, and proper procedures for safe participation in games, sports, and recreational pursuits.</p>
Greek	<p>HCCS students will learn to read, write, speak, and understand Greek beginning in Kindergarten.</p> <p>Beginning with simple words and phrases first, then sentences and readings. Each lesson contains a vocabulary of new words and many idiomatic phrases translated into English.</p> <p>Singing, games and plentiful opportunities for conversation and practice are integral components of Greek Instruction.</p> <p>Greek Culture - Aesop's Fables, Mythology, Philosophers, Greek Folk Dancing</p>
