Math Block

May is a magical month for math! The students will begin Module 7 and work on Problem Solving with Length, Money and Data. This module presents an opportunity for students to practice addition and subtraction strategies within 100 and problem-solving skills as they work with various types of units within the context of length, money, and data. Students represent categorical and measurement data using picture graphs, bar graphs, and line plots. They will revisit measuring and estimating length from Module 2 but they will now use both metric and customary units.

Math Goals

- Estimate length using inches, feet centimeters, and meters
- Measure to determine how much longer one object is than another
- Solve word problems involving money
