Dear Students and Parents/Guardians:

The purpose of summer reading is twofold: one, to enjoy the activity of reading, and two, to maintain comprehension skills, fluency, and stamina during the summer months. We strongly encourage students to read as many books as possible, but **all students entering grades 6-12 are encouraged to read at least two books**. Students will choose their own books, except for students who will be taking AP English Language and AP English Literature courses; those students have required reading as noted below.

We recognize that COVID-19 closures have made access to bookstores and libraries challenging. For that reason, there will not be a September assessment on summer reading.

Students who will be taking AP English Language and Composition must read James Baldwin's essay, "Notes of a Native Son," and another work of their choice. The Baldwin text can be accessed here: [Notes of a Native Son, James Baldwin](#).
