

Co-Curricular Clubs at DTS 2018-2019

Clubs and competitions are a fun way to stretch your muscles, your brain and your skills. For further information, parents and students can email the teacher associated with the club.

ARCHERY with Mr. Deneka

Participants will shoot field style archery. This is also known as Olympic style archery.

Mr. Deneka is hoping to see this club expand into a team sport that will be able to shoot in state and national competition.

It is open to 5th through 8th grade. This club meets two times per week, before school from January through May.

JAZZ and 5th GRADE BAND with Mr. Komarek

Students will practice music during morning rehearsals.

Open to students grades 5 through 8. These rehearsals are held in the morning. The sections meet two times a week from September through June. Jazz: Tuesday, 5th Grade band: Thursday

CHORUS with Mrs. Scialla

Fourth and Fifth grade Chorus is a performing group that focuses on singing in several parts and healthy vocal production.

Meets from Sept. to May, 45 minutes per week before school

DISSECTION CLUB with Mr. Deneka

Eighth grade students will conduct a series of dissections designed to lead them through a progression of techniques used to examine the interior structures of large organs such as heart valves, eyes, digestive and reproductive tracts.

The club will meet during October and November, three hours per week, and meets on Wednesday evening. Maximum of 12 participants

DTS MUSICAL CLUB with Mrs. Scialla and Ms. Fisher

Depending on the interest and number of participants, the Drama Club will produce a drama or a musical production as a full production.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONGRESS with Ms. McShane and Mrs. Terranova

Meets November through April. Hours and meeting schedule varies, typically twice a month for an hour. Open to all students 6th to 8th.

LITERACY JOURNAL CLUB with Mrs. Joyce and Ms. Quinn Also known as Wildcat Word Wizards

As a club, our members write and solicit pieces of writing from all school students, then help edit the writing. We create a bound journal of the work.

Students create posters and meet with classes for submissions. The activity culminates in a celebration reading at a school-wide event at the end of the activity.

This club meets from January through June, 3 hours a month after school, and is available to all grade levels. Hours increase in May to finalize the project.
