- Admission will be on first come, first served basis. **ONLY** the first 100 applicants from each school will be accepted. **PLEASE BE SURE TO REGISTER FOR THE CORRECT SCHOOL.** Registration for all students who register for the wrong school will not be honored.
- Registration will open on Monday, November 26th, 2018 and will remain open through Friday, December 7th, 2018, *OR once all 100 applicants have been accepted. The link will no longer be active for a school that has already reached their quota. Contact the appropriate person listed below to reserve a space on the waitlist.*
- We will provide lunch and a snack, but **not breakfast** for the participants. Please make sure your son/daughter has a good breakfast before arriving at Homewood-Flossmoor the day of **SNOWFLAKE**.

In an attempt to help you understand what your son/daughter has encountered and to share the **SNOWFLAKE** experience, ***there is a special parent information session for you and other family members scheduled from 5:15 to 5:30 p.m.*** Please be on time. Your participation will give you a better understanding of your son’s/daughter’s experiences. The closing will make more sense to you if you are present for its entirety. ***If you cannot attend, please let us know as soon as possible.***

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. A \$30 fee will be due at the time of registration which covers food, a sweatshirt, and small group activities. Please be aware that absolutely no refunds will be given. Scholarships are available on a limited basis – contact Cathryne Czarnecki at Hart
2. Parents are responsible for participant's transportation. You should report for registration in the HFHS South Building Cafeteria **no earlier than 7:15 a.m. and no later than 7:45 a.m.**
3. Participants must follow all Operation Snowflake rules and attend/participate in all scheduled activities from 7:15 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on January 26, 2019. **IT IS AN ALL DAY EVENT AND YOU MUST BE PRESENT FOR THE ENTIRE EVENT!** No student is permitted to leave before the program concludes.
4. Participants are not permitted to possess non-prescription drugs, alcohol and cigarettes.
5. MEDICATIONS: All prescription and over-the-counter medications must be turned over to the Staff nurse at the time of registration and must be in their original containers. Inhalers should be kept.
6. Snowflake or Homewood-Flossmoor High School will not be responsible for personal items lost or stolen.
7. Please leave all iPods, iPads, cameras, cell phones, weapons and money at home, as they are not allowed. Gang signs or gang activity will not be tolerated.
8. If relatives need to contact participants by phone, the number to call is **708-369-5590**. ***These are to be emergency calls only!*** Relatives may have to try to call several times and allow the phone to ring several times. Participants will not be allowed to use the phones to call home unless permission is granted by one of the Directors.
9. Participants should notify their group leaders immediately in the event of serious illness or injury. The Snowflake nurse will notify the participant's parents immediately.
10. ** Confidentiality should be kept.
