Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Scholarship

The Alpha Kappa Alpha Scholarship Fund was established for the purpose of providing financial assistance to students who meet the following criteria:

1. The applicant must be a high school senior planning to enroll in an accredited institution of higher education for the purpose of obtaining a certificate, associate degree, bachelor's degree or the equivalent, or more.
2. The applicant must have an overall GPA of 3.0 and a minimum SAT score of 800, or the equivalent of at least 17 on the ACT.
3. The applicant must be planning to enroll or is currently enrolled in a full-time course of study, 12-15 semester hours or the equivalent.
4. The applicant should have a current official transcript sent to Xi Beta Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Scholarship Fund, P.O. Box 273, Griffin, GA 30224 by **March 1st**.
5. The applicant must complete and mail the scholarship application and three letters of recommendations to Xi Beta Omega Chapter, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Scholarship Fund, P.O. Box 273, Griffin, GA 30224 by **March 1st**. Three letters of recommendations must be from the following: a teacher; a non-related person of your choosing; a pastor, mentor, or another person of your choosing.
6. The applicant must reside in one of the following counties in order to be eligible for the Alpha Kappa Alpha Scholarship: Henry, Lamar, Pike, Spalding, or Upson.
Applications, transcripts, and letters of recommendations postmarked after **March 1st** will not be considered. Please see Mrs. Bailey in guidance to pick up the application.

The American Legion Legacy Scholarship

Those eligible to apply for the scholarship shall be the child/children or legally adopted child/children or a child of a spouse by a prior marriage or dependent child as defined by the United States Armed Services of active duty United States military and National Guard, and military reservists who were federalized and die on active duty on or after September 11, 2001. The applicant must be a high school senior or high school graduate to apply for the scholarship. Scholarship is for undergraduate study at an accredited institution of higher education within the United States. Application must be post marked no later than **April 20, 2019**. Carl Flowers Memorial Athletic Scholarship

A scholarship has been established in memory of Carl Flowers. Scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:

- be a graduating senior of Upson-Lee High School in good standing.
 - must compete in two or more varsity sports for at least two years of high school at ULHS.
 - have at least a 2.7 overall GPA
 - submit application with a typed essay on the topic “How has participating in sports at Upson-Lee contributed to your life and what are some of the lessons you have learned from participating?”
 - must be enrolled in college the fall semester following his/her high school graduation.

Programs may include degrees in welding technology, plumbing, culinary arts, respiratory care, nursing or other technical/vocational pursuit.
- Other related programs may be considered on a case-by-case basis

FAFSA

Every senior should complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This application enables you to apply for any federal money that you may be able to receive. The website www.studentaid.ed.gov/complefafsa or www.fafsa.ed.gov contains detailed instructions for every question on the FAFSA. The online application offers the applicant instructions, help screens, and even live online help from a customer service representative. This form also needs to be completed in order to apply for the HOPE Scholarship. The school will not be receiving paper FAFSA forms. Students will be able to obtain a paper FAFSA by calling the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243). Students may request up to three copies of the paper application and should receive their FAFSAs in 3-7 business days.

French Baron Cason and Thomas H. Cason Memorial Scholarship

WALKER ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP 1. To be considered, a complete application packet MUST be submitted by **April 19, 2019**. 2. Omission of any part of the application will eliminate the application from consideration. 3. Applicant must be planning to become an **education major** and currently have a minimum of a 3.0 cumulative Grade Point Average on a 4.0 scale. Applicant must be actively involved in extracurricular activities and verifiable community service. 4. Parent/Guardian of applicant must sign Disbursement of Scholarship Funds Agreement. 5. Academic scholarships will be awarded upon verification of enrollment from your college. Verification entails an enrollment form completed by the institution with the Registrar's signature and official seal of the institution or a copy of Fall schedule. Scholarship checks will be made payable to the college/university. Please see Mrs. Bailey for a copy of the application.
