Jared Box Project Suggested Toy List

- Infant (0 to 12 months) -

Soft cover or cardboard books, rattles, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip onto strollers or cribs, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, crib mirrors, busy boxes, light up toys, musical toys, OBalls. Lamaze, Bright Start, and Sassy brand crib toys are great.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for infants. Be aware of choking hazards.

- Toddler (1 to 3) -

Soft cover or cardboard books, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip onto strollers or cribs, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, musical toys, pillow-cases, fun socks, chunky crayons, coloring books, picture flashcards, bubbles, Play-Doh, plastic cars, small dolls. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for children under 3. Be aware of choking hazards.

- Preschool (3 to 5)

Crayons, coloring books, grab-n-go activity kits, Play-Doh, books, stickers and sticker work books, matchbox cars, nerf or rubber balls, stuffed animals, flash cards, bubbles, fun socks, small action figures, small dolls, travel size games, Silly Putty, simple puzzles, colorful pillowcases, princess crowns & dress up items, toy farm animals and dinosaurs, activity books, card games such as Go Fish, Old Maid, matching games. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for Preschoolers.

- Elementary (5 to 8)

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, coloring books, word searches, activity books, reading books, matchbox cars, nerf balls, stuffed animals, stickers, Play-doh, Silly Putty, flash cards, Lego kits, travel games, craft kits, joke books, hand lotion, craft kits, colorful pillow case, fun socks, Slinky, My Little Pony, action figures, puzzles, deck of cards, UNO card game. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for school age children.

- Tweens & Teens (8 and up)

Crayon, colored pencils, coloring books, word searches, writing journals, Play-doh, stuffed animals, card games, Lego kits, puzzles, books, magazines, Chapstick, hand lotion, doodle pads, travel size games: Sorry, Connect 4, fuzzy/colorful socks, nail polish, jewelry making kits, craft kits, paint sets. Other items that are labeled as suggested for teens.

Extended Learning Opportunities Session 3

- Please call us when your child will be absent from their class; 627-4889.
- Class will meet once a week for 6 weeks.
- Class begins right after school and ends at 4:30 sharp. There will be an additional charge of \$25 for every 15 minutes late.
- Parents are responsible for their child's transportation home.
- Pick up: Please park your car across the street from the school when picking up your child. **NO parking in the school's driveway.** This is a safety concern.
- Classes will not be held on holidays, days of early dismissal or when school is closed due to inclement weather.
- Parents will be notified by the district's K12 Alert when ELO classes are cancelled due to bad weather or other circumstances. Students will be instructed to go home on their regular dismissal bus at 3:30. It is the responsibility of the parent to have their updated contact information on K12 Alert.
- If classes are canceled for any reason an extra class will be added at the end of the session.
- The School Nurse is not on the premises during ELO. There is no access to any medication that is kept in the nurse's office.
- There are a limited number of spaces available for each class. Please fill out this form & return it to school with a check made out to Nanuet Family Resource Center by April 13, 2018.
- There will be an additional \$10.00 late charge for any permission forms received after April 13, 2018. No forms will be accepted the first week of classes.
- Refunds: \$10.00 charge for withdrawal prior to the first class, 50% after the first class, no refunds given after the second class.
- If the class your child signs up for is full or cancelled we will notify you.
 Otherwise assume your child will be attending the class you have chosen.
- Please send a note to your child's teacher informing him/her that your child will be staying after school for an ELO class. Please include the name of the class, the day of the week it will be held and the dates of the 6 classes.

- If you will be picking up students from ELO at Miller & Highview, Please pick up your student at Highview first.
