- Every student MUST register for this school year. If your child attended Washington or any other school within the district, you MUST register and update their information. This needs to be done immediately so that your child is recognized and not marked absent. Please go to the district website at www.scec.k12.in.us. Please click on Parents...then click on Skyward Family Access...then you will be sent to Skyward where you can log in and update your child's information.
- 2. Getting Credit for Attendance:
 - Students must be logged on promptly for morning attendance at 8:30am daily (M, T, TH, and F).
 - Students will have lunch from 11am-12pm daily.
 - Students must log back on for afternoon attendance at 12:00pm daily (M, T, TH, and F).
 - Wednesday login times are 9:30am and then again at 12:00pm (Wednesday).
 - All assignments must be completed and submitted to the teacher.
 - All students must log in to "Specials" and complete assignments for "Specials" as directed by your teacher daily.
- 3. Please be advised that teachers are available daily during to conference/planning times to meet with you. The available times are 8:00am-8:30am and 2:30pm 3:00pm (M, T, TH, and Friday) and similar hours on Wednesdays. Please reach out to your child's teacher for more details.


