2018-19 Guidelines for the Kaiser Foundation Scholarships

- 1. Ten (10) graduates from Wyoming public high schools will be selected.
- 2. The Kaiser Foundation Application Form and supplemental information must be completed by the applicant and submitted to the guidance counselor or principal of the high school where he or she attends.
- 3. A three person committee from the school will select one (1) student's completed application to be sent to the Executive Director of the Kaiser Foundation. Only an application submitted by the guidance counselor or high school principal will be accepted.
- 4. This scholarship is valued at \$4,000.00 a year. It may be renewed for an additional four years (5 years total) for this same amount. The college student must submit the following information to the Foundation in order to receive continued funding:
- A. The student must earn at least a <u>2.5 high school grade point average</u> to qualify for the scholarship and maintain <u>at least a 2.5 college grade point average</u> to qualify for each additional year of the scholarship.
- B. The student must successfully complete <u>at least 12 college credit hours each semester</u> in order to qualify for continued scholarship funding. The foregoing information must be verified by submitting copies of university/college transcripts, or other evidence of credits earned, to the Executive Director of the Kaiser Foundation.
- C. Each year, before the fall semester, verification of enrollment must be received by the Executive Director of the Foundation. The Foundation recognizes that there may be a change of college any time after the freshman year and will take that into consideration for renewal of the scholarship.
- 5. This scholarship, if all requirements are met, will be good for up to five years of <u>undergraduate</u> education funding. However, any scholarship recipient who fails to maintain full-time student status and/or fails to attend an institution of higher learning for a consecutive period, not to exceed five years or until obtaining a bachelor's degree, whichever occurs sooner, shall automatically forfeit all rights to receive scholarship funds for the period of such absence.
- 6. Applicants must realize that only 10 students from the state will be recipients of the scholarship. Normally, there are over 50 applications received by the Foundation. Applicants should be sure to do their best to follow the guidelines to earn one of these very generous scholarships.
- 7. The money will be made available shortly before the fall semester of each school year.
- 8. The funds from the Foundation are projected to be available for many years. However, there could be unanticipated circumstances that would affect future revenues over which the Foundation has no control. If that should happen, applicants would be duly notified.
