Plateau Valley School District 50

Plateau Valley School District is a consolidated school district in Western Colorado serving the rural communities of Collbran, Mesa, and Molina.

The district operates two schools. Plateau Valley School is a pre-K through 12th grade school, approximately 310 students, serving the resident families of the district. Grand Mesa High School is an alternative high school serving students of Collbran Job Corps, a federal job training facility for young adults.

Plateau Valley School is located three miles west of the town of Collbran and is nestled between Battlement Mesa and the Grand Mesa. It is named after Plateau Creek which runs below the school on its way down through the valley to join with the Colorado River.

Grand Mesa High School is designed to meet the special needs of the Job Corps students. It is located at the Collbran Job Corps Center, which is one mile west of Collbran.

Hunting, fishing, camping and winter sports are favorite leisure time activities in Plateau Valley. Vega Reservoir, one of the largest of nearly a hundred reservoirs and lakes in the area, is only twelve miles east. Grand Mesa, the largest flat-top mountain in the world, offers a variety of year-round activities. Powderhorn Ski Area is located on the Grand Mesa and is quickly gaining fame as one of the state's favorite ski areas. There are a variety of community organizations in the valley which support other leisure time interests.

The Plateau Valley Clinic serves local medical needs. A doctor and qualified staff are available along with airlift services for an extreme emergency. Police protection is offered by the Mesa County Sheriff's Department and the Town of Collbran. The valley is served by a local volunteer fire department, with stations in Collbran, Molina, and Mesa. Plateau Valley is served by the "911" system for emergencies.

There are numerous churches throughout the valley which serve the spiritual needs of protestant and Catholic denominations. Shopping is available in the valley and in Grand Junction, a major commercial and business center, which is only 45 minutes away.

Plateau Valley is a beautiful, peaceful, secluded area of Mesa County known for its rural, outdoor lifestyle. The traditional economy of the valley is centered in agriculture, with the U.S. Forest Service, BLM and recreational interests as other major employers. The elevation of the valley is approximately 6000 feet, and the climate is temperate, with mild winters and warm summers.
