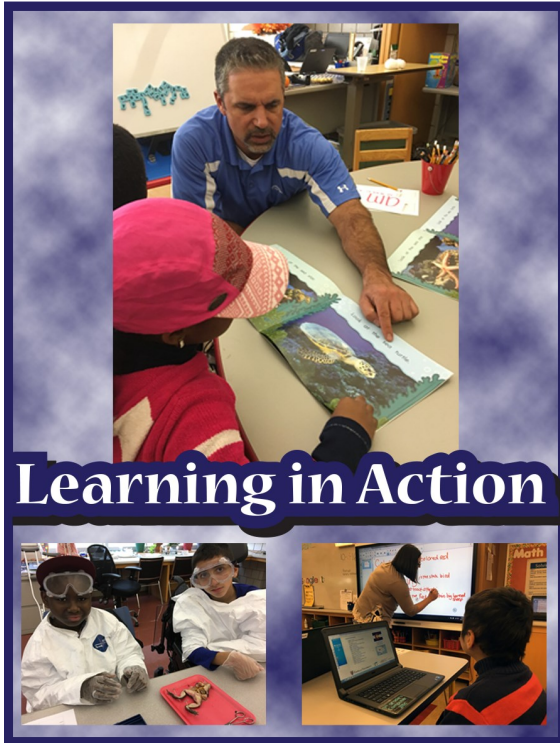


Together Everyone Achieves More

We are a New York State Public School District with an accredited high school and TASC program.

We have a New York State curriculum driven program for school age students ages 3-21.

Mt. Pleasant Blythedale UFSD is a K-12 New York State Special Act public school district*. We are the only public school district in New York State located on a hospital campus.

Students, ages 3-21 who require intensive therapy and medical services, can attend school as either inpatients or day students.

We are located in central Westchester County, convenient to the New York City boroughs, Long Island, Lower Hudson Valley including Putnam, Rockland, Orange, and Dutchess counties.

Who do we educate?

We educate students who are inpatients and day hospital patients at Blythedale Children's Hospital; students who need intensive therapy and medical services; and students who need a seamless education in preparation for their return to their home districts.

*There is an on-campus special education pre-school.

We are a community where students can learn as their bodies heal.

We offer:

- ◆ Alternative to homebound instruction
- ◆ Equal access to public education
- ◆ Least restrictive environment
- ◆ Work/study program
- ◆ Parent support groups

At Mt. Pleasant Blythedale, students participate in classes while working on rehabilitation goals. At the time of discharge a comprehensive transition program helps students, parents and local school districts identify appropriate placement options.
