Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

Elementary Goals

1. In grades 3-8, the current year student achievement as measured by each Assessment Index, will meet or exceed the 2019 scores.

2. K-2 ELA Fluency-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 80% on the K-2 High Frequency Word Unit Lists.

3. K-2 ELA District Assessments-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 80% on the K-2 ELA District Assessments.

4. 3-5 ELA District Assessments-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 75% on the 3-5 ELA District Assessments.

5. K-2 Math Fluency-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 80% on the K-2 Fluency Assessments.

6. K-2 Math District Assessments-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 80% on the K-2 Math District Assessments.

7. 3-5 Math District Assessments-80% of elementary schools will maintain an average of 75% on the 3-5 Math District Assessments.

School Goals

1. Current year school performance (SPS) is 82.3 the students will meet or exceed this index by 3.85 to 86.15.

2. Current ELA index is 90.46. We will meet or increase by 1.14 (91.6).

3. Current math index is 87.16 and will increase to 90 in the 2019 (+2.84)
