Chaparral Elementary will host their Thanksgiving luncheon on Nov. 14, 2019.

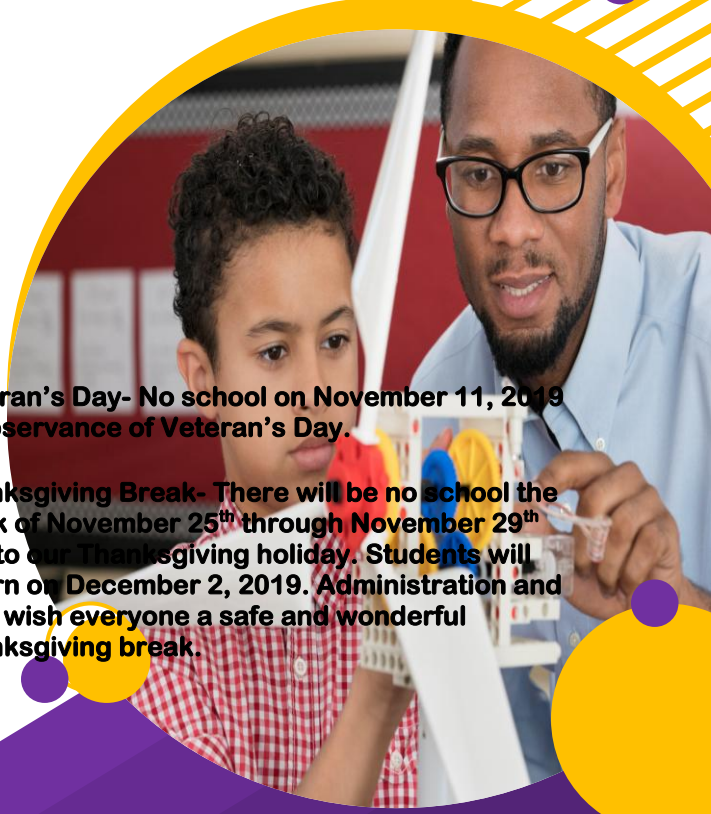

Winter Weather Information:

If the temperature factoring wind chill is 32 degrees or lower, students stay indoors for recess and P.E.

If weather consist of rain, hail, snow, sand storm and lighting occurs within an 11-mile radius students are brought inside.

If temperature is higher than 41 degrees, students may go outdoors for recess and P.E.

Temperatures are determined using weatherbug.

Student Release and Transportation Changes:

No changes of transportation over the phone. If changes need to be made please provide a letter to the main office or your child's teacher or stop by the front office to make the change. Any changes of transportation should be done by 1:45 p.m. Students will not be removed from the bus after 2:00 p.m. Please make sure you pick up your child with enough time.
