Tattnall County will improve the number of proficient learners on GMAS (EOC and EOG) for all content areas by 3%.

**North Tattnall Middle School’s GOALS:**

North Tattnall Middle School will decrease the percentage of students scoring in the Beginning Learner level in Reading by 10% in grades 6-8.

North Tattnall Middle School will increase the percentage of students scoring in the Distinguished Learner level by 10% for Math in grades 6-8.

Make good choices such as paying attention in class, staying on task, doing my best, respecting my teachers and working hard at school and home.


Obey the school and bus rules.
