General Announcements:

The school-based health center (Clinic) in your child's school is honored to have the privilege to serve your child. We have heard from some parents that there is information circulating on the radio about school based health centers and we want to be sure you have the correct information. Enrolling in the clinic does not change who your regular doctor is. You may keep your regular doctor as well as receive care in the clinic. Insurance companies and Medicaid allow you to use both services. When you enroll your child in the school based health center, you give them permission to provide medical and mental health treatment. This includes treatment of illnesses, physical exams, immunizations, and mental health counseling. For these services your child must be enrolled in the clinic.

Recourses:

Free identification card for all New York City residents IDNYC is the new, free identification card for all New York City residents, which gives all of us the opportunity to show who we are—New Yorkers. As a government-issued photo identification card, IDNYC gives you access to City services. IDNYC benefits every city resident, including the most vulnerable communities—the homeless, youth, the elderly, undocumented immigrants, the formerly incarcerated and others who may have difficulty obtaining other government-issued ID.

IDNYC also provides a dynamic series of benefits to cardholders, including a free one-year membership at many of the City's leading museums, zoos, concert halls, and botanical gardens.
