On Wednesday of this week, we received a late notice from ComEd that Western Avenue would experience possible long-term or intermittent power outages between the hours of 3:30 pm and 7:00 pm. We needed to notify parents that after-school programming would be cancelled, and it needed to be done in less than an hour and fifteen minutes. There was also a special message to send for all our students who participate in Extra Innings. That was a short amount of time to communicate so many messages to a large number of families!

I was reflecting on Friday during our Snow Day. I thought about Wednesday—and how many parents I watched call their neighbors and say, "Hey, STEM is cancelled, I'll take David home, pick him up when you get off of work." The only response when teachers walked into the Main Office after we announced the need to clear our building by 3:30 pm was, "What can I do to help?" On Wednesday, Western Avenue chose to show kindness during a time of need. Our families, teachers, and staff came together so that by 4:00 pm, our building was empty, and ComEd was able to do their work.

I just wanted to take this time to thank everyone who pitched in Wednesday evening. It is days like the ComEd power outage evening that I remember how grateful I am to be a part of Western Avenue's community. It was a hectic moment, but people chose to show kindness and to work together.



Student Files

Our secretary is currently updating all student files in the Main Office so that we have all required documentation for our students on file. Classroom Visits from Parents

At Western Avenue Elementary, we welcome visits from our parents into classrooms! However, please remember to contact your teacher directly via email or phone at least 24 hours in advance to arrange a date and time for your visit. Especially now that testing has started, it is important that if a visit is arranged, that it is done around the testing windows. Thank you in advance for your support!

Traffic Flow at Arrival and Dismissal Times

Parents, we understand that everyone is rushing to get their days started in the morning. However, we need to do a better job driving safely in the drop-off and pick-up lines. We have three staff members directing traffic at the front lot, two staff members posted at door I, and multiple people posted at the playgrounds and blacktop area between the playgrounds. We also have one person directing traffic in the North parking lot. Please remember that there is a traffic flow. Students must be dropped off in the designated car lines. Please do not drop off your children on any other street or sidewalk other than the designated lines. Please do not wait in line to make sure your child walks to the door because that stops the flow for other parents behind you. And please be very mindful when you are pulling away from the car line. There should only be one priority for morning drop off and afternoon pick up--and that priority is the safety of all our kids at Western Avenue. If we all work together, we can ensure the safety of all students. Thank you!
