SCORE REPORTS ARE ONLINE and ENTERED INTO NAVIANCE!

Tenth and eleventh grade students who took the October PSAT/NMSQT should have access to the score reports by now. In order to access the score report, a College Board account needs to be created. Online reports are comprehensive and provide access to College Board tools to assist you in reviewing the test and identifying areas where you are strong and areas where you may need to strengthen. Additionally, your online account will link to KHANAcademy providing a library of practice resources and materials as you move forward. Scores are also available on Naviance as you plan your post-secondary options! Your actual test booklet may be picked up in the Guidance Office.

- To educate persons as to their constitutional rights and to take all lawful action to secure the exercise thereof, and to take any other lawful action in furtherance of these objectives, consistent with the NAACP's Articles of Incorporation and this Constitution.

COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY SCIENCE HONORS PROGRAM

The Columbia University Science Honors Program (SHP) is a highly selective program for high school students (Grades 9th-11th) who have a strong interest in science and mathematics. The SHP holds classes at Columbia University from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Saturdays throughout the academic year. Courses are given in the physical, chemical, biological, behavioral, and computing sciences, as well as in pure and applied mathematics. The program and its courses have no tuition charges; however, families of SHP participants are asked to consider making a voluntary contribution to help support the program.

The selection of students is based on the online application, grade transcripts, letters of recommendation, and student performance on an entrance examination to be taken at Columbia University on either April 6, 2019 or April 27, 2019. There is a \$30.00 testing fee that must accompany the application. Students can access the online application on the SHP web page: <https://app.applyyourself.com/?id=COL-SHP>.
