Dear Parents / Guardians:

Nanuet Senior High School is sponsoring its annual Homecoming Dance on Friday, September 27th, from 6:30 PM to 9:30 PM. The enjoyment of the dance and the safety of the students is our priority for the evening. With this in mind, please be advised of the following procedures:

- This event is for Nanuet High School Students **ONLY**.
- As with all school-sponsored activities, all school rules are in effect during the Homecoming activities.
- Homecoming Dance is a semi-formal affair; therefore, appropriate attire (no jeans, sneakers, etc.) is required.
- Entrance to the dance is from the side doors near the cafeteria only. Except for emergencies, no other exits may be used that evening.
- Students are not permitted to enter the dance after 7:45 PM.
- Students that elect to leave the dance early must leave the property and are not permitted to return to the dance.

**Please be advised that all tickets must be purchased in advance; they will not be sold at the door that evening. Tickets will be sold during unit lunch in the cafeteria beginning on September 13th. Cost will be \$25 per ticket. Payment can be made in cash or check made payable to Nanuet Senior High School.**

The dance will be chaperoned by teachers, staff members, administrators, and the high school resource officer on assignment from the Clarkstown Police Department. Before students enter the dance, they will be met at the door by chaperones. If a student is suspected of being in possession or under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, the parents or guardians will be contacted. The student will be removed from the dance and suspended from school. Possession of controlled substances or alcohol will also result in police intervention.

Frequently, students attend pre and post-dance parties. Please do your part to ensure that all students have a safe evening. Contacting the homes of the families hosting the parties to assure a substance-free environment is appropriate.

The Homecoming Dance is a clear example of students and staff working in unison to provide a safe and appropriate social opportunity for the students of Nanuet Senior High School. We are looking forward to September 27th.
