IMPORTANT INFORMATION

School Health Services Regulations Required by NYS Effective 7/1/18:

Recent health exams are required in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and **11.**

Vision screening for distance & near vision acuity will be required within 6 months of admission to school and in grades Pre K or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, and **11.**

Hearing screening utilizing pure tone testing will be required within 6 months of admission to school for K, 1, 3, 5, 7, and **11.**

Scoliosis screening will be required in grades 5 and 7 for girls and **grade 9 for boys.**

All 12th graders must submit proof of the 2nd meningococcal vaccine (2 doses needed by September). They cannot participate in a sport if they do not submit proof of the 2nd dose.

11th graders: Recent Physical Exam forms must be on file.

Care Plans, P.E. modification documents, Parent Permission Slips are all available on the nurse website to be downloaded.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT CHILD IMMUNIZATION CLINIC

PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASS MAKE UPS

SPORT PHYSICALS

Sports Physicals for the 2019-20 seasons will be offered on Thursday, June 6th at 2:30 in the Main gymnasium. Any student who plans to participate in a fall, winter or spring sport will need a recent physical to be eligible. Private physicals will be accepted as well. Health examinations are required for all 9th & 11th graders. Other required years will be K, 1, 3, 5, 7th as well. Therefore, all 11th graders are required by New York State to have a recent physical by their private physician or they can have it done by Dr. Ingrassia the school physician on this date.
