The Rockland County Youth Bureau is pleased to announce that the Rockland County Youth Employment Program – T.E.E.N. Works (Teen Employment Education Network) is now accepting applications for the 2020 summer program. This program is funded by the County of Rockland and is designed to provide eligible youth with a meaningful workforce training. This 4-week program will offer pre-employment training to teens and young adults between the ages of 14 and 20 to strengthen their ability to become self-sufficient and responsible. NEW YORK STATE SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATHEMATICS (STEM) INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The NYS STEM Incentive Program provides a full SUNY tuition scholarship to the top 10 percent of students in each NYS high school if they pursue a STEM degree in an associate's or bachelor's degree program and agree to live in NYS and work in a STEM field in NYS for five years after graduation.
