You will build on the work you have done this year and prepare for your sophomore year by completing the two parts of this assignment. Keep in mind the following rules:

Use magazines, newspaper articles, books, reliable Internet sites, etc. You **MUST** provide a *Works Cited* list with your project documenting all the sources that you used to complete the project. Part One: Health and the Global Perspective

You are working for the World Health Organization. You have been hired by the country of _____ to create a health brochure on _____ (disease). This brochure will be distributed to local health centers, hospitals, teen centers, schools, and other local organizations. The brochure will be used to educate and inform residents on how to reduce their risk of contracting the disease.

Choose a disease/epidemic: *Zika Virus, HIV/AIDS, Malaria, Tuberculosis, Dengue Fever, Rabies, Trachoma, Buruli Ulcer, Leprosy, Ebola, Chagas disease, Human African trypanosomiasis, Cysticercosis, Cholera, Influenza, Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy, SARS, or another disease of interest (must be approved by Advisor).*

Choose a country, which is currently affected by your chosen disease.

After researching and gathering information about your chosen country and disease, your final products will be a fact sheet about your country and a well-developed tri-fold brochure about your disease, similar to one you might pick up at a doctor's office, or health clinic. This brochure must be visually interesting and include photographs, charts, tables, graphs, and illustrations. Additionally, it must be informative. It must describe the causes of the illness, how it spread, how it can be treated/prevented, as well as the overall effects of this disease on individuals as well as the country. Be sure to address the social, political, and economic implications of the illness on the country. You can access many brochure templates through MS Word, MS Publisher, MAC Pages, as well as on the internet.

Part Two: Creative Writing and the Global Perspective

Write and illustrate a poem, myth, short story, song, or another **creative writing piece that elaborates on the disease you have researched.** You will be graded on creativity, content, and mechanics. You should use different fonts, sizes, and colors for your text in order to place emphasis on certain words or phrases in your writing piece.

The best piece from each advisory will be submitted into a competition, and be submitted for publication in the school newspaper.

Grading Requirements

Part One:

Separate Fact Sheet (1-2 pages)

- Student's Name
- Name of disease
- Name of country
- Population Demographics: Males, Females, Adults, Children, Birth Rate, Death Rate, Infant Mortality
- Government: Structure of Government (Democracy, Monarchy, etc)
- Economy: Currency, GDP (Gross Domestic Product), etc
- Health Care: General information on health care access: Number of Hospitals, Number of Doctors/Nurses, Annual Health Care Budget, etc
- Flag: Drawn or printed in color

Brochure:

- Attractive cover for your brochure

- Inside of brochure must contain:

1. Background on the Disease

- Label and define disease
- How it affects the body
- Symptoms of the disease
- Risk factors which contribute to its development
- Ways in which individuals can reduce their risk of contracting the disease
- Potential treatments or cures-include most recent developments in preventing and treating the disease (within the last three years)

2. National Data Analysis

- Who is susceptible to the disease (gender, age, race, group, most affected)
- What treatments are available in your country?
- How do individuals in your nation obtain treatment for this disease?
- What options for treatment exist in your country?
- How effective are treatments in your country?
- How has the illness impacted the country and its people? (Be sure to address the political, economic, and social implications of this disease.)

****Be sure to include illustrations, graphics, pictures, tables, charts, and maps****

Back Page of Brochure

- A complete list of works cited, including Internet sites (URL), magazine or newspaper articles you have used to complete your brochure.

Part Two:

Creative Writing Piece

- Well-written and beautifully illustrated poem, myth, short story, song, or another creative writing piece.
- Writing piece elaborates on the disease you have chosen by showing a more personal perspective of the impact of the disease on the individuals and their families.
- The creative writing piece showcases your creativity, ingenuity, and innovation. You can and should be adding a very personal touch to this portion of the project.
